TRIO WORKS!

TRIO Programs are our nation's way of carrying out a commitment to educational opportunities for all Americans regardless of race, ethnicity, disability, family educational history, or economic circumstance. They are funded under the Title IV Higher Education Act of 1965. TRIO Programs help students overcome class, social, and cultural barriers to higher education and to realize their educational potential.

TRIO Programs provide services to students who come from low-income families and whose parents have not graduated with a four-year degree. Congress has mandated that two-thirds of those students enrolled in TRIO Programs must fall into both categories. Students enrolled in today's TRIO Programs are drawn from diverse backgrounds.

TRIO Programs employ High Impact Practices (HIP) to increase Student Success. College graduates are working in education, industry, government, medicine, law, communications, sales, finance, transportation, publishing, law enforcement, technology, engineering, and numerous other professions. **Florida TRIO** dates back to the original federal initiative. Staff, students, host institutions, and advocates from both sides of the aisle dedicate every effort to achieve post-secondary access, enrollment and completion.

Federal TRIO Programs and Primary Service Goals

- **Upward Bound** - High school graduation with rigor, college enrollment & completion
- **Talent Search** - Middle and high school progression, college enrollment & completion
- **Educational Opportunity Centers** - College entry, re-entry, & completion for adults
- **Upward Bound Math Science** - High school graduation with rigor, STEM degree
- **Veterans Upward Bound** - College enrollment & completion for military veterans
- **Student Support Services** - College retention & completion at 2-/ 4-year colleges
- **Ronald E. McNair Post-Baccalaureate** - Enrollment in graduate school and research

Currently, there are **91** TRIO programs in Florida that serve **26,438** individuals and brought in **\$27,015,284** in revenue into Florida in 2018.

- There are 46 programs serving 11,009 middle and high school students (Talent Search, Upward Bound and Upward Bound Math Science)
- There are 34 TRIO programs serving 5,453 college students (Student Support Services and McNair)
- There are 11 TRIO programs serving 9,976 adults (Veterans Upward Bound and Educational Opportunity Centers)

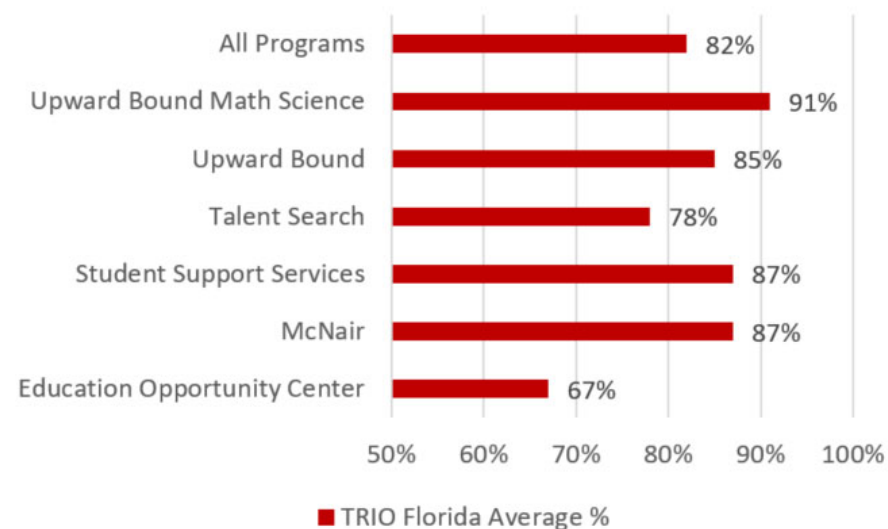
Throughout the last fifty years, the FLTRIO programs have sustained families and communities.



FLTRIO POSTSECONDARY ENROLLMENT OBJECTIVES

Florida TRIO postsecondary enrollment and retention performance exceeds comparison groups for Pell eligible and first-generation in college students.¹ Florida TRIO even outpaced nationwide college enrollment, which includes students from all economic and cultural backgrounds (85% UB & 91%UBMS vs. 68% US).²
